### Message from Pastor Roy

**He is Risen! He is Risen, indeed!** In this season of New Life, we celebrate our risen Lord. Death was powerless to silence his life and ministry. Christ is alive! As a faithful healer and teacher, he released his life into God's care where life never ends—giving *us* courage to do the same. Our tendency is to fear death as the end of life and the loss of meaning. Jesus lived otherwise. His example proclaims that life faithfully lived with God, among family, friends, and neighbors is the source of true freedom. Releasing our life into the care of God as we live and die gives us peace in our living and our dying. Death is not the end of life. Our life flows on in many ways after our “days on earth” are done, for our life is hidden with Christ in God both in life and in death. Easter is the promise and fulfillment of meaning and hope in our lives. As the Spirit invites us to entrust ourselves to God in living and dying, we are in good company with all the other saints and our Lord Jesus Christ.

Even as Christmas reminds us every year that Christ is God in flesh, so Easter reminds us each year that the best of life grows out of following the example of Christ who released himself into the care of God in resurrection. Early Christians naturally picked up the practice of gathering on Sunday mornings as a weekly celebration of Christ's resurrection. Sunday worship has always reminded the church that Jesus' resurrection is the core of our faith. Christ's life gives us courage to live and serve with love. In the face of the seeming meaninglessness of death, our life and the life of others who precede us in death goes on by the grace of God in resurrection hope and joy. It is a mystery, yes!--but one which gives us courage to live in faith every step of the way. Thanks be to God.

He was able to handle all the stress and face all the dangers associated with his career. Where he had problems was at home, with a deteriorating marriage that threatened to end in a divorce. He and his wife still loved each other, however Caleb was too self centered and afraid to admit the errors of his ways. This included his alienating himself from his wife, and God. It was only with guidance from his Dad that finally brought him to realize that his marriage was indeed worth saving, and that he needed to re-build his relationship with her, and, finally to accept God as his personal Savior. The very ending will completely astound you as you are unable to see it coming at all. A very gripping and compelling film from the beginning to the end.

## Meet Maya~A Story of Hope

Maya Lulanga is less than a year old. Her father, Mike, couldn't have been more thrilled when Maya was born. But he was also scared. Mike knew of many little children who never made it to their fifth birthday.

“Two years ago, close to where I live in Chinsapo, Malawi, a baby girl was born. So beautiful and charming was this little angel with her babyish smile and pink cheeks,” Mike remembers. “One day the mother noticed something strange. The baby was shivering and the body temperature was rising. The baby would not stop crying.”

The little girl had malaria. A preventable, treatable disease caused by the bite of an infected mosquito. When she passed away she was only three months old.

To most of us in the United States, mosquitoes are nothing more than a nuisance. But in Malawi and many parts of Africa, just one bite from a mosquito could transmit malaria and lead to death. By providing mosquito nets, medication and comprehensive health education, the ELCA Malaria Campaign is working to eliminate deaths from this disease—for good.

By sleeping under an insecticide-treated mosquito net, Mike, baby Maya and the rest of the family have stayed healthy for almost a year. And so have many other families in the community. But that's not all. “The money which could have been used for medical bills [to treat malaria] is now used for other things. It helps me and my family save money.” With savings and good health, the future looks bright for baby Maya.


