

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## Message from Pastor Roy

There was once a spiritual leader who had just enjoyed a restful meal with his disciples when an agitated farmer approached and complained that his 12 cows had gotten away *and* his crops were destroyed by insects! After the master explained that they had not seen the cows, the farmer went his way. The master told his disciples, “Do you know that you are the happiest people on earth? You have neither cows nor crops to lose.” Jesus speaks similarly when he invites us to sell our possessions and give to the poor. In the book of Acts the wealthy in the early church sell goods and property and share the proceeds with the poor among them. I doubt that the wealthy believers in Jerusalem impoverished themselves by giving everything away. However, by freely releasing wealth, they found freedom. Of course, St. Francis and others in history have given away *all* their wealth and found great joy in doing so.

When we give something away, we prove to ourselves that we no longer need it. A joyful freedom arises unexpectedly. This is true of money, time, possessions, and our sense of control. When we freely give away something which we wish to keep, we push ourselves to renegotiate the “operating system” of our faith and life. For despite our efforts to trust God in all things, deep down we mostly trust in ourselves and in our own power to find meaning, survive, and be “happy.” Though we are often satisfied that we trust God, when our actions push us beyond our comfort zone, we learn that we have room for growth.

Ultimately, we want to trust God but often we do not allow ourselves to exercise this trust. By pushing out the limits of our giving into greater generosity, we are stretching our faith with action. That is why there is such a struggle when we go to give something away or do something that will not clearly benefit us in the end. The conflict is that we want to trust God but also retain control and make sure everything works out ok. When we release and share, we struggle as we battle against the fear of “not having enough,” as our wayward survival instincts “dig in.” The cross of Jesus and the resurrection teach us that freedom comes with giving and releasing in love, not by grasping and clinging with a spirit of fear. Human instinct buys temporary security at the price of high anxiety and broken relationships. Jesus invites us to choose wisely.

**“A NOTE ABOUT OUR BACK PAYMENT OF PAYROLL TAXES”**

Over the past 9 months we have gone through the process of calculating and paying Parish back payroll taxes which we neglected to pay because of the complexity of the now mandatory electronic filing and payment process. We have filed and paid all of the taxes which we owed. Very recently we received by mail the expected federal penalties for failing to file and pay these taxes.



Though we are willing and quite able to pay these penalties and interest, we are, at the strong suggestion of Bruce Segrist, our Synod Treasurer, taking a close look at appealing the penalties (which come to approximately \$17,500). Certainly some of the penalties and all of the interest will be paid at the end of the appeals process, but we are granted an appeal process by the IRS and will likely follow that process since our operating expenses are paid by your donations and those of past members. As long as we enter the written appeals process or pay the interest and penalties before the deadlines on the penalty notices (6/9, 6/16), we will continue to be within our legal rights and obligations to the IRS. If you have any questions about this process or further details, Pastor Roy or one of the parish officers would be glad to explain with greater detail.

Clearly, none of us intended to neglect the payment of these taxes; but it happened. As fellow members of the body of Christ we are members one of another and we all share an interest in the resolution of these matters. Let us renew our resolve to help one another as we are able, whether that be providing meals, offering a word of comfort or encouragement, or helping assure that together we meet our civic obligations.

We now contract with Jones Accounting Services to electronically file and submit our payroll taxes to prevent errors like this in the future.

We are fortunate to be linked as congregations and to have more than sufficient funds to pay whatever we owe in due time. Most gratefully, we continue to be in a good position to be a ministering presence in our community and world. I believe the caring and hope-filled way we have responded to this financial error reveals the cooperative and good natured spirit of our congregations. I am grateful for the ways I see you practicing your faith in the successes *and* disappointments of our congregational life together.


I am glad for my part in the ministry and presence of Faith United Lutheran Parish in our community and world. Thanks be for the mercy and peace of God in all of our lives.

**SYNOD ASSEMBLY 2014** (*Twenty-Seventh Annual Assembly*)

June 6 - June 7, 2014

at Messiah College, Grantham, Pennsylvania

**Feeding the Hungry**

The 2014 Lower Susquehanna Synod Assembly will gather on Friday, June 6 and Saturday, June 7. The theme of this twenty-seventh annual assembly is “Feeding the Hungry.”

Joining us this year to reflect on issues of hunger and justice will be keynote speaker and churchwide representative **Dan Rift**, Director of **ELCA World Hunger**, and **Amy Reumann**, Director of **Lutheran Advocacy Ministry in PA** (LAMPa), as our Bible study leader. As the highest legislative authority of this synod, voting members from congregations engage in conversation, vote on resolutions, synod council and board nominations, worship and learn together as a community of faith.

**Conference Assemblies** come together in the spring for conversation and discernment about action items on the Synod Assembly agenda.

Assembly is scheduled to open at 9:00 AM on Friday, June 6 and adjourn at 1:00 PM on Saturday, June 7. This year’s assembly will feature a pre-assembly **food packaging event**, “Loaves and Fishes,” **Friday forum opportunities**, worship, and an opportunity for rostered leaders to be photographed for a **synod pictorial directory**.

What better way to begin our Synod Assembly, with this year’s theme of “Feeding the Hungry,” than by actually doing that? We are partnering with Thrivent Financial and Messiah College to sponsor a food packaging event on **Thursday, June 5** that will provide 300,000 or more meals to people in central Pennsylvania. This mammoth event will take 12 hours, 900 volunteers (working in 2-3- hour shifts) and \$75,000 to meet our goal.

Summer youth camp programs include games, swimming, campfires, Bible study, crafts, songs, Christ-centered worship, nature activities, and well-trained counselors who care.


Family Camp at Kirchenwald proudly presents the family vacation everyone can enjoy! Celebrate your family in this unique camp experience.







Filey's will have a unique opportunity for us to join them **June 22** at 10:15AM. They will have guest speaker Dr. Jess Socrates present "*The Science behind the Shroud of Turin*". Here is Dr. Jess Socrates bio:

Dr. Jess Socrates, a devoted husband and proud father is an active and a productive member of his local community in Hanover, PA as well his native country of the Philippines. He obtained his medical degree from the University of the Philippines and completed his Pathology Residency at York Hospital in York, PA. He is currently the medical director of Hanover Hospital Laboratory where he has spent 33 years of his professional career as a pathologist. His specialty deals with the microscopic evaluation of body tissues and occasional performance of autopsies. He has served as president of the medical staff and continues to sit in the Medical Executive Committee.

He is happily married to his wife of 35 years, Luz Socrates, a registered nurse who also graduated from the University of the Philippines. Their marriage is blessed with 3 beautiful and talented children: Aileen, 33 an educator and motivational speaker; Ryan, 30, a percussionist, Jazz musician and college instructor; and

Eric, 26, a trumpet player and 4th year medical student. During their formative years, Dr. Socrates was actively involved in their educational and extra-curricular activities in school and in the community. He considers his family as his most precious treasure in life. In his home parish at Immaculate Heart of Mary in Abbottstown, he is a 4th degree member of the Knights of Columbus.

Despite the demands of raising a family during his younger years and meeting professional obligations at work, Dr. Socrates has always managed to find the time to engage in community service. As an active Rotarian, he subscribes to the ideals of "service above self" and integrates that principle in his family, church, workplace and community. This call to service has matured to a vocation which he has fully embraced as an authentic witness to his Catholic Christian Faith. This is manifested in the many outreach projects he has accomplished through the different service organizations that he is a part of:

1. Rotary Club of Hanover- spearheaded the installation of hand pumped wells in five remote villages and one school with 750 students in southern Philippines. This was followed by construction of sanitary toilets that now serve the needs of over 15,000 students in 3 schools.
2. PHI KAPPA MU International- founding member of this group of medical fraternity brothers, a past president and current treasurer. He helped establish the "Operating Room Assistance" project that has resulted in the surgical repair of hundreds of children with congenital deformities like cleft lips and palates, hernias, heart defects and meningoceles.
3. Foundation for Aid to the Philippines, Inc. - As VP of this non-profit based in Baltimore, MD whose mission is to "help others help themselves," he has facilitated the operation of 7 ongoing livelihood projects in scattered areas throughout the Philippines. These include seaweed and herbal farming; cow, pig and goat fattening; bakery/banana chip production, jewelry crafting, hand tractor operation, sampaguita farming & purple yam cultivation.
4. Missionaries of the Poor- For the past 13 years, he and his wife provided financial support to this religious community of Brothers and priests who serve the poorest of the poor in seven countries. The annual fundraising dinner they hold in their home during Advent, generates much needed funds to help support the brothers' works of mercy as they care for destitute families and social rejects that include abandoned and homeless men, women and children with mental and physical disabilities.



